

Summerfest, 'better every year,' kicks off Friday

The good news just keeps jammin' its way in.

Not only is Friday through Sunday the dates for Livingston's ever popular Summerfest, but the National Weather Service is forecasting sunny and very warm temperatures for the much anticipated 13th annual spectacle.

Add in a music lineup event organizers are certain will keep visitors dancing sunup to sundown, a near endless number of vendors to quench the thirst, appetite or almost any other need of music-goers and a fun-filled weekend is complete.

"It gets better every year," said City of Livingston Assistant Director of Public Works Sandy Wulf.

With temperatures expected to exceed 90 degrees each day, city organizers have taken every step to ensure a good time for both young and old.

The city pool is open to the public for free during Summerfest; the recently remodeled Civic Center is

also open, offering cool temperatures; and the city will also have a number of tents at the band shell to provide shade.

Music is the biggest attraction of the event. It promises to provide a little something for everyone.

Friday kicks off with Little Jane & The Pistol Whips and concludes with The Max.

Saturday includes The Fossils, Western Skies, The Clintons and Band of Heathens.

Sunday features Tom Catmull and The Clerics, The Trishas, and the headliner group, Pinky & The Floyd.

But there's more to Summerfest than music. The event offers something for everyone.

Cornerstone Community Fellowship will again sponsor children's activities ranging from face painting to crafts, games, and much more inside the Civic Center.

Food vendors consist of Montana BBQ, which just won first- and second-place awards for its barbecue sauce at a competition in Las Vegas.

There'll also be Mexican and Asian cuisine, hamburgers, New York pizza,

sandwiches, kettle corn, ice cream and much more.

Vendors will also be selling everything from children's toys to hats, jewelry, beachwear, photography, stained glass, skin care products and crystal.

"We have a record number of vendors this year," said Wulf. "That's exciting."

The weekend also features new and classic cars as well as a drop-off area for the Soles4Souls outreach.

Soles4Souls collects new and slightly used shoes to give relief to the victims of abject suffering around the world.

Tickets for Summerfest are available at the Chamber of Commerce, Cellular Plus, the City of Livingston Court House Office, the city's Utility Office or online at www.livingstonmusicfestival.com.

Three day passes are \$20 for persons 13 and older, and \$10 for youth ages 7-12. Daily passes are \$15 for adults and \$5 for children.

Youth ages 6 and under are admitted for free.

Liquid Blue, 'World's most traveled band,' to play at The Murray Bar on Saturday

Liquid Blue, a multi-award-winning international recording and touring act, which bills itself as "the world's most traveled band," will play at The Murray Bar on Saturday at 9 p.m.

There is a \$5 cover charge for the event.

The San Diego-based ensemble has performed in more than 100 countries and holds a Guinness World Record, according to the band's website, liquidblue.com.

The band scored a Billboard Top-10 Hit in 2010. In 2005, Liquid Blue became the first American act to be signed by a major Chinese record label and was chosen to represent the United States at the CCTV kick-off concert for the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing.

The group, which has performed at sold-out, ticketed shows worldwide, is a certified green business, according to the website.

"In both their live shows and recordings, Liquid Blue cranks out slammin' dance rock music," the site states.

Honored as "America's Best Dance Band" by the National Music Awards, Liquid Blue was also named "Entertainment Act of the Year" at the 2012 Biz Bash Readers Choice Awards as well as "Entertainer of the Year" at the 2011 Event Solutions Spotlight Awards.

The band covers more than 600 songs, including a multitude of musical styles.

Liquid Blue features two Grammy winning musicians (bass and sax), a

former Elektra Records recording artist (guitar), a Billboard hit songwriter (keys) and a Chinese Idol finalist (vocals).

On the female side, fronting the group is Nikki Green and the multi-talented BlueGirls trio, according to the band's website. In 2010 Nikki became the first American ever to qualify for the finals in Chinese Idol. The male fronts are Ellis Hall III and Scott Stephens. Scott is a former pro Roller Derby skater with the L.A. T-Birds. DJ Layla is a former World-Champion Surfer. The most recognizable band member is "The Grovler," with his top hat, blue beard and nasty

guitar playing. There is also an optional horn section available, Blue-Brass. Band alumni include Sony recording artist BC Jean, who started her career with Liquid Blue in 2003 and was recently signed by Clive Davis.

Liquid Blue was named "America's Best Independent Artist" twice (2004/05) and also finished runner-up for "Best Band" twice at the International Music Awards (2006/07).

In other Murray events, tonight the folk and pop group The Leles (folk and pop) will play at 9 p.m.
